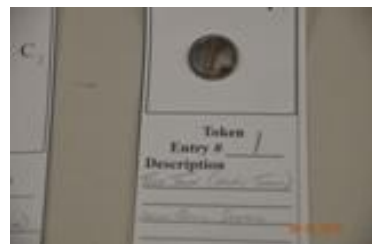

Mouse Balls.....(Computer)
