I WILL not destroy property, building or what is left of ghost towns and deserted structures. I will not tamper with signs, structural facilities or equipment.



Alternating each year from U.S. to Canadian soil, the hunt this year (or should I say hunts!) will take place in the U.S. on Sunday, August 28th at John Stymelski Veterans Park in Livonia MI. The park is located at 14275 Stark Rd, Livonia, MI 48154. Michigan Treasure Hunters is the host club for 2016, and we will be welcoming our metal detecting friends from the Chatham-Kent (Ontario) club to this year's event. The park is located directly behind Eddie Edgar Ice Arena. There are restrooms within walking distance. The 1st hunt of the day will take place at 11 a.m. so plan on arriving around 10:30 am to check-in. If you would like to help plant the coins for the first hunt, please arrive around 9 a.m. (I could use a couple helpers out there!) The plan is to have a hunt starting at 11 a.m. sharp, followed by a break for lunch, and two hunts in the early afternoon. There will be domestic and foreign coins a plenty -- old and new -- over the course of the three hunts. There will be hundreds of silver coins and plenty of tokens redeemable for prizes in the ground as well. I displayed some of the coins you could find and prizes to be awarded at the April Open House meeting. Similar to last year's hunt in Canada, the final hunt of the day will carry a small entry fee (\$5). But a token found in this hunt will be redeemable for a nice silver or gold prize! Several gold coins will be handed out after this final hunt of the day. There will be raffles as well that will feature Silver Dollars and a detector! The first two free hunts and the third gold & silver hunt are open to all current/paid members of MTH and the Chatham-Kent Metal Detecting Club. If you haven't paid your dues and wish to participate in this hunt, please pay asap! The club will again be providing some food, beverages (pop/water) and picnic related items like plates, utensils and napkins.
